## notes

The product is completely biodegradable and recyclable. Special runs available upon request. Fedrigoni Arena® Ivory Bulk has a bulk of 1.7 and contains CTMP (chemi-themo mechanical pulp) a raw material that allows to obtain higher thicknesses but that can bring slight variations in the shade and occasional small spots from one making to the next compared to Ivory Smooth and Ivory Rough versions.

The Company reserves the right to modify the technological features of the product in relation to market requirements.

**applications**

Fedrigoni Arena® Ivory Bulk can be used without problems with the main printing processes: traditional and UV or H-UV offset, embossing, hot foil stamping, screen printing, letterpress. The macro-porous surface works best when using semi-oxidative drying inks. Fedrigoni Arena® Ivory Bulk has good chromatic and tone performance.

**printing  
suggestions**

Varnishing and plastic laminating must be assessed in advance. Varnishing applied with an offset machine is almost fully absorbed and therefore does not improve gloss or protection. Screenprinting varnishing achieves better results, although it's often necessary to perform two runs to achieve best results. The surface roughness, typical of uncoated papers, may give rise to micro defects with plastic laminating caused by incomplete adhesion of the film to the paper. Good results are achieved with major processing operations such as cutting, die-cutting, scoring, folding and gluing.
